Luke 5:12 And it happened when He was in a certain city, that behold, a man who was full of leprosy saw Jesus; and he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean." Then He put out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately the leprosy left him. (NKJV)

Luke 5:12-13 While He was in one of the towns, there came a man full of (covered with) leprosy; and when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, Lord, if You are willing, You are able to cure me and make me clean. And [Jesus] reached out His hand and touched him, saying, I am willing; be cleansed! And immediately the leprosy left him. (AMP)

God has HEALING mercies.

Matthew 9:27-30 When Jesus departed from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out and saying, "Son of David, have mercy on us!" And when He had come into the house, the blind men came to Him. And Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord." Then He touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith let it be to you." And their eyes were opened. (NKJV)

Healing is a mercy. Mercy is unearned, unmerited and has nothing to do with how good you've been or how bad you've been.

Healing has already been bought and paid for. You can't buy it. You are bought with a price. My healing is bought and paid for. Healing is a mercy. We don't deserve it but mercy doesn't depend upon you deserving it.

Mercy means you don't get the judgement and punishment you should have got. You do get the good things the blessings and healing that you shouldn't have got.

Psalm 86:15 But You, O Lord, are a God **full of compassion**, and gracious, Longsuffering and **abundant in mercy** and truth. (NKJV)

Psalm 86:15-16 But You, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in mercy and loving-kindness and truth. O turn to me and have mercy and be gracious to me; grant strength (might and inflexibility to temptation) to Your servant and save the son of Your handmaiden. (The Amplified Bible)

Matthew 14:14 And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick. (NKJV)

In this multitude there had to be some people that didn't deserve it. There were all kinds of people in this multitude even hoodlums and prostitutes.

Matthew 14:14 When He went ashore and saw a great throng of people, He had compassion (pity and deep sympathy) for them and cured their sick. (The Amplified Bible)

MOVED 4697 [splagchnizomai / splangkh·nid·zom·ahee/] v. Middle voice from 4698; TDNT 7:548; TDNTA 1067; GK 5072; 12 occurrences; AV translates as "have compassion" seven times, and "be moved with compassion" five times. 1 to be moved as to one's bowels, hence to be moved with compassion, have compassion (for the bowels were thought to be the seat of love and pity). (Enhanced Strong's Lexicon)

The love and mercy of God healed these people. The mercy of God healed them all.

Philippians 2:25-30 Yet I considered it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, fellow worker, and fellow soldier, but your messenger and the one who ministered to my need; since he was longing for you all, and was distressed because you had heard that he was sick. For indeed he was sick almost unto death: but God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow. Therefore I sent him the more eagerly, that when you see him again you may rejoice, and I may be less sorrowful. Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness, and hold such men in esteem; because for the work of Christ he came close to death, not regarding his life, to supply what was lacking in your service toward me. (NKJV)
